

Freshman Team Dominate Milby 38-0

Move to 3-0 for the Season

The Bellaire Freshmen displayed a balanced offensive attack and a stifling defense to overwhelm Milby Thursday afternoon 38-0. Bellaire combined 176 rushing yards with 132 passing yards for a total offensive production of 308 yards while the defense held Milby to negative 3 yards in total offense.

Running back Melvin McAdams had his second 100-yard plus game in 3 games tallying 124 rushing yards on just 6 carries for a 20-plus yard average with 2 touchdowns. Quarterback Jacoby Pringle also contributed a 100-yard plus game with 8-13 passing for 132 yards, adding 6 rushes for 45 yards for total offense of 177 yards.

The tone off the game was set early as McAdams took the first handoff behind excellent blocking and ran 75 yards on the first play for a touchdown. The Bellaire defense, led by Keith Ewing, Dorian McNeil, and Kyle Green, took early command of the line of scrimmage each contributing 4 or more tackles or assists.

Ewing broke the game open in the 2nd quarter with a 30 yard punt return for a touchdown putting the Cardinal up 22-0. Throughout the game, defensive efforts continuously frustrated Milby with quarterback pressure and relentless pursuit by the Cardinal freshmen defense.
